#### **NEW YORKTOWN PHOTO FROM 1940**

Here's a really great overhead view of the *Yorktown* in 1940, its deck loaded with 1930s-vintage aircraft. Note the oversize "Y" on the island, to aid pilots in getting to the right flight deck in prewar maneuvers. (Wouldn't the IJN aircrews have appreciated that at Midway?) <u>Click here</u> to open the photo and note that you can select and download a very high resolution copy of the picture (28 mb), and that's recommended for a really good view of the aircraft.

#### **NEW B-17 AIRCREW AND AIRCRAFT LISTS**

In our <u>April newsletter</u> we announced the recovery of our long-missing aircraft and aircrew data files, originated by Mark Horan and Chris Hawkinson in the 1990s. However, those files had almost nothing relative to the B-17s operating from Midway. Now we have it, thanks to Roundtable member Bill Longton in Florida, who found it with exceptional detail in a USAAF archive.
